## **Chinese Minor**

Learn Chinese language, culture, society, literature, and linguistics from historical and contemporary perspectives. Our classes encourage active participation and communication in a friendly and supportive environment. The Chinese minor combines language courses with culture, literature, and linguistics courses. Chinese is one of several minors taught within the Department of East Asian Languages and Literatures.

## **Minor in Chinese**

The Chinese minor requires a minimum of six upper-division courses (24 graded credits), which must consist of at least three language courses, two courses in literature, linguistics, and/or culture, and a sixth course with a CHN or EALL subject code. At least three of the six courses must be taken in residence on the University of Oregon campus from the Department of East Asian Languages and Literatures.
